

DAY 1-

The following Psychometric Tests will be performed:

1. Intelligence Quotient (Standard Progressive Matrices)

IQ stands for intelligence quotient. Supposedly, it is a score that tells one how “bright” a person is compared to other people.

2. Differential Aptitude Test

An aptitude test is an instrument used to determine and measure an individual’s ability to acquire, through future training, some specific set of skills. This test covers several areas including, Verbal Reasoning, Numerical Ability, Abstract reasoning, Perceptual Speed and Accuracy, Mechanical Reasoning, Space Relations, Spelling, and Language Use. The tests are performed under exam conditions and are strictly timed.

3. Bells Adjustment Inventory

Adjustment is a process by which people respond to environmental pressure and cope with stress. It is the relation between the individual and the environment. The Adjustment Inventory will tap an individual’s adjustment in the following areas Home, Health, Emotional, Social, and Total Adjustment

4. Self-Directed Search

The Self-Directed Search is a career interest test that asks questions about the student’s aspirations, activities, skills, and interests in different jobs. From the responses, the SDS produces a personal three-letter Summary Code, which can be used to find occupations and fields of study that match well with the student’s personality. The SDS is based on John Holland’s theory that both people and working environments can be classified according to six basic types: Realistic, Investigative, Artistic, Social, Enterprising, and Conventional. These personality types are known together as RIASEC.
